Contestants on the local level are required to raise \$100.00 for each local pageant that they enter during the state pageant calendar year. MISS BROKEN ARROW CONTESTANT ELIGIBILITY RULES & REGULATIONS

A. A contestant may not compete unless she has made application to participate and meets the following requirements as set by the Miss America, Miss Oklahoma and Miss Broken Arrow Organizations.

B. A contestant may compete if she is a bona fide resident of Broken Arrow, living within the Zip Code area as defined by the Broken Arrow Post Office as of March 2 of the current year, and has been a bona fide resident for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant competition. A contestant must supply proof of residency if required, consisting of copies of two or more of the following.

1. Current driver's license issued in the State of competition or current automobile registration issued in the state of competition; or
2. Current voter's registration card or written statement from the applicable Broken Arrow voting registrar of valid current registration in the State of Oklahoma; or
3. Current lease in the contestant's, parents/guardian's name of housing in the Broken Arrow zip code area; or
4. Current utility bills in the contestant's or parents/guardian's name in the Broken Arrow Zip Code area, or
5. Information sufficient to the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant that the contestant is in the Broken Arrow Zip Code area with her parents or legal guardian but attends a college or university outside the area or state; or
6. Most recent federal income tax return showing the State as the State of residence and the most recent State income tax return filed by resident taxpayers of Oklahoma (Financial information may be deleted)

The Miss Broken Arrow Pageant has the right to reject information if it feels that the above documentation has not been gathered or provided in good faith.

C. A contestant may compete in the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant even though not a resident therein, where she is and has been a bona fide full-time employee employed by employer forty hours or more per week as verified by employer for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant and has maintained such employment until the State Finals; or

D. A Contestant may compete if she is a student of a high school within the Broken Arrow Zip Code area; or is a full-time student (minimum 12 hours per semester in a college, university or trade school outside of her permanent residents.

E. A contestant who has graduated from Broken Arrow High School, and whose parents have moved, may compete if she is a full time student at an Oklahoma college or university.

F. One or more of the requirements set forth in paragraphs B, C and D above, must be in existence at the time of the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant and the Miss Oklahoma Pageant and, if selected, must remain in effect through conclusion of the Miss Oklahoma Finals as applicable.

G. A contestant is ineligible to compete in another Local Pageant anywhere in the United States in the same year that she has been selected the winner of the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant (i.e.; a contestant may not hold two local titles simultaneously) and is ineligible to compete in the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant where she has previously been selected the winner for a minimum of 2 years.

H. A Contestant shall not be less than 17 years of age on the date of the local pageant in which she competes, nor more than 24 years of age on December 31 of the year of the Miss America Pageant in which she will compete.

I. A Contestant must be a citizen of the United States at any time before the commencement of the Miss Broken Arrow Pageant and remain such throughout her participation with the program.

J. A Contestant must possess and display talent in accordance with the rules set forth in the Official guide for Contestants Participating in a Preliminary Pageant.

K. A Contestant may be either amateur or professional.

These rules are in accordance with the Miss Oklahoma and Miss America Franchise Agreement with adaptations made and approved for the Miss Broken Arrow Scholarship Pageant Board of Trustees.

Instructions for Completing the Miss Broken Arrow's Contestant's Resume

Please remember. This is your opportunity to demonstrate to the judges why they should consider you for the job of Miss Broken Arrow. You may list as many or as few items under each category as you desire. Your only restriction is that it must follow the established format and it must fit on one page. This page, combined with the Platform Statement, will comprise your entire application for this job. The judges will receive exactly what is submitted. Any items submitted that do not fit the established criteria will be returned for correction only once. Any items that do not meet the criteria or are submitted after the deadline will not be given to the judges. If your resume arrives on the day of the deadline, but does not meet the criteria, there will not be time to return it to you; therefore, it will not be given to the judges. The contestant may explain the lack of judging materials during her interview, if she so chooses.

1. Go to the word processing program of your computer.
2. Start a "new" document
3. Set margins for 1" on all four sides. You may use the font style of your choice. It may not be any smaller than "10" and no larger than "12" point type. Remember, depending on the font style and font size chosen, the number of times you should hit the tab bar will change. Please refer to the attached sample to verify you are following the requested format.
4. With the justification set for left, type "**Name:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), hit the space bar twice. Then, type your name as you wish the judges to know it. (If your name is LaCricia Shawntel Smith and you want to be known as "Shawntel Smith", please type "Shawntel Smith").
5. Then, move to the next line and type, "**Hometown:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), hit the space bar once. Then, type your hometown including the city and the state. Hit the tab bar approximately six (6) times and type, "**Contestant Number:** _____". You will not know your contestant number at the time you are typing this information, which is why you will need to type a line. If you notice, it is "Contestant number", then a colon (:), hit the space bar twice and then begin the line. All of which is in bold. Type the line to be long enough to reach the end margin. Depending upon your font and font size, you may need to hit the tab bar 5, 6, or 7 times for it to look correct. The "C" in contestant does not have to line up with the "D" in date (see below), even though it appears that way on the attached sample.
6. Move to the next line. Now set your justification to the right. Type "**Date of Birth:**" in bold. Hit the space bar two (2) times, and type the month, day, and year of your birth. (i.e., October 10, 1979)
7. Move Justification to the left. Double space down. "**Education:**" in bold. Hit the tab bar three times and then type your most recent school first and **your classification for the fall**. If it is grad school, indicate it as such. List degree seeking (all on the same line as the name of the school), move to the line underneath that to list your undergraduate school and degree sought/achieved, and below that list your high school. If you are a High School Senior go ahead and list your college for the fall (ex. Oklahoma State University – Freshman)
8. Double space down. Hit the tab bar once. Type "**Platform Issue:**" in bold. Hit the tab bar three times. Type the TITLE of your platform, MAKING SURE IT LINES UP WITH THE INFORMATION ABOVE IT. DO NOT TYPE ANYTHING OTHER THAN THE TITLE.

9. Double space down. Hit the tab bar once. Type **“Scholastic/Career Ambition:” in bold**. Hit the Tab bar once, **MAKING SURE IT LINES UP WITH THE OTHERS ABOVE IT**. Then type the type of degree/education you would ultimately like to achieve and beneath that, list your career ambition.
10. Double space down. Hit the tab bar once. Type **“Talent:” in bold**. Hit the tab bar three times. Type the type of talent and specific selection. **MAKE SURE IT LINES UP WITH THE INFORMATION ABOVE IT**. (i.e., Pop Vocal - “Crying”, Tap Dance - “Staying Alive”, etc.)
11. Double space down. Type **“Scholastic Honors:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
12. Double space down. Type **“Leadership Roles:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
13. Double space down. Type **“Accomplishments:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
14. Double space down. Type **“Interesting Facts:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
15. Double space down. Type **“Employment:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
16. Double space down. Type **“Legacy:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. This should be typed in sentence form. Please write what your legacy as Miss America will be. This statement should answer the question, “A year after giving up your title as Miss America, what we will remember about your year of service?”
17. Double Space down. Type **“Why I should be crowned as Miss Broken Arrow this year:” in bold**. Hit the space bar twice. Explain to the judging panel why you should be selected Miss Broken Arrow and, more importantly, why you should be selected Miss Broken Arrow this year. Why is it critical for you to be Miss Broken Arrow.

Please remember that the entire form MUST FIT ON ONE PAGE using the Times New Roman font style. You must leave a 1" margin on all four sides of the page.

judgment on what is most important for the judges to know about you. Use your space wisely. Attached you will see an example of what it should look like. Any variations from this form will be returned to you and will not be accepted. Your materials will not be retyped. The judges will receive your original work.

This form will be given to the judges along with your platform statement. You will notice there is a required signature line at the bottom of the platform statement. When these two pages are put together, they will create your entire application. Your signature will cover the materials listed **ON BOTH PAGES**. Your signature verifies that everything on your forms is true and accurate. If it is proven that any information on these forms is not true, correct, and factual, you risk losing your local/state title.

Some spacing issues may arise. Simply follow the example provided.

I would partner with a well-known screen writer and an independent film company to write and produce this movie that will also utilize popular television and film actors who donate their time for this great cause. The production and the premier can also be supported by my platform's national sponsors, PBA, AAOP, and physicians nationwide.

Please remember - This is your opportunity to explain to the judges what your chosen platform is and why it is important to you. Your platform statement should be a subject that you feel is important to young women of today. This page ONE (1) page, singled-spaced document, combined with the Contestant's Resume, will comprise your entire application for this job.

1. Go to the word processing program of your computer.
2. Start a "new" document
3. Set margins for 1" on all four sides. You may use the font style of your choice. It may not be any smaller than "10" and no larger than "12" point type using the Times New Roman font style.
4. With the justification set for left, type "**Name:**" in bold. Following the colon(:), hit the space bar twice. Then, type your name.
5. Then, move to the next line and type "**Title:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), hit the space bar twice. Then type your name.
6. Double space down. Set your justification to "center". Then type in **Bold and underline** the title of your Platform.
7. Double space down. Write what you feel is critical for the judge's to know about your platform and why it is necessary for you to have the job of Miss America to promote this issue. What you write will be what the judges know about your platform, your role in successfully dealing with this issue, and the role the Miss America Organization may play in your plan.
8. The essay may include some of the following items (this is not to be meant as an exhaustive list):
 - > A clear definition of the platform and the specific issues you wish to address
 - > A plan on how you have or will create awareness of the platform
 - > The way in which you have or will change attitudes regarding the issue
 - > The way in which you have or will change behaviors related to this issue
 - > The way in which your platform issue will move the Miss America Organization forward
 - > Your media plans
 - > Your marketing strategy
 - > How you propose to fund your ideas/plans
 - > Any significant accomplishments you have made in regard to your issue
9. At the bottom of page, you Must set the justification to the right. Type a line of 26 spaces. Below that line, you must type Signature/Date. Once you have printed the document, it is important that you **Sign** and **Date** this document. Include in your packet the original and 4 copies.

Vision: Helping Children See a Brighter Future

Why do some seemingly normal and intelligent children remain illiterate, even with good schooling? Even worse, why do some of these same children turn to a life of crime? You may be surprised to learn that the answer is: poor vision.


It is true. Eighty-five percent of all learning occurs through the visual system and twenty-five percent of all children have a vision problem significant enough to affect their learning. As aware as we think we are about various physical challenges in our society today, a great number of children are still going undiagnosed. Vision problems interfere with the ability of children to perform to their potential and are the roadblocks to learning most frequently overlooked by parents and teachers. These children often have behavioral issues as well, and their actions are sometimes diagnosed as another type of learning disability or psychological disorder.

Even more disturbing is the fact that seventy percent of all juvenile delinquents have uncorrected vision problems. Most inmates in adult correctional facilities today have vision impairments that have gone untreated from childhood. There is no denying the toll that vision problems have taken on these individuals who have a feeling of failure, low self-esteem, and disinterest in school. Many have become the proverbial "drop-outs" of society. There is also no denying the toll undiagnosed and untreated vision problems are taking on our nation's economy – and the crime victims are paying the highest price.

The good news is that proper early childhood vision screening and vision testing are the most effective ways to detect problems, and to catch a child who may be missed as they move from grade to grade and into society as adults. As a future optometrist, the hard-hitting statistics compelled me to become involved in educating our citizens about vision screening and testing and to support Oklahoma's newest and most aggressive law for screening all public and private school kindergarten, first, and third grade students. I have teamed up with Prevent Blindness Oklahoma (PBO), an official branch of Prevent Blindness America (PBA), as a volunteer for statewide fundraising efforts. PBA is a non-profit organization that works to raise money for free vision screenings, perform screenings at local schools, provide advocacy, and other services. Also, in January of 2008, I was named an official spokesperson for the Oklahoma Association of Optometric Physicians (OAOP) and will travel on their behalf to provide education and advocacy regarding childhood vision testing. Both PBO and OAOP were instrumental in seeing the new Oklahoma law created and passed. As an official representative, I will serve their efforts to help local schools implement the new law.

Another job I will perform for these organizations is to provide fun and interactive presentations about vision for elementary students. My presentations will include reading aloud a children's book called, *Arthur's Eyes*, which will give students more understanding and respect for their vision, and for other children who must wear corrective eyewear. At each local school I will visit with administrators and teachers about signs they can look for to detect vision problems, and provide them with informative pamphlets that children may take home to their parents.

If poor vision is all that stands between one fourth of our children and success, then it is a temporary roadblock. I am committed for the rest of my life to removing it. As Miss Oklahoma 2008, and ultimately Miss America 2009, I am resolved to lead a powerful partnership of the Miss America Organization, Prevent Blindness America, and America's Optometric Physicians to perfectly advance all our purposes. Too many children have already grown into adulthood with correctable vision problems – now is the time to act, and there is no time to waste. Together, we will make a brighter future for all children to see.
